He had an insight into every child and keeps in touch with his ex-students. He is known for his hospitality and got goodies from his farm in Kerala which he shared with everyone. He is always cheerful, calm and collected. He loves to talk about politics, Shashi Tharoor being his favourite. His jokes and sense of humour appeal to all. The Headboys of past years had all mentioned his witty comments in their last address.

The Chairperson then requested Mr. Gopalakrishnan to say a few words.

Mr. Gopalakrishnan thanked Mrs. Samuels and welcomed all. He mentioned it was pleasure to teach the children. He also commented on the parental support that the children from this school had. He stated that the real mission is to be with the right school, with right people and the right facility. Some will test you, some will love you, some will teach you. He expressed his sincere thanks to all the teachers who played an important role in his life. He thanked Mrs. Isaacs for giving an opportunity to his children as well. The library in Junior school was a nurturing environment due to her efforts. Mrs. Isaacs also mentioned that her beautiful calligraphy was a marvel. All the certificates have her writing and the children should appreciate this fact.

She wished all four of the members of the staff well and assured them that they went with lots of wishes and blessings and hoped they would continue to be in touch. She stated that it was not a farewell but just an au revoir.

Mrs. Isaacs mentioned that after summer holidays there would be a few changes. The building for the IB was still in the pipeline. Therefore, the std. 8 children would move to Middle School and Std. 5 to Junior School from June. It would be cramped, but manageable and she hoped all the parents would co-operate with the changes. She stated that a circular would be sent about the changes shortly.

Mrs. Isaacs then thanked the previous committee and she welcomed the current team. She said that the parents who give so selflessly to the school are really like the wind beneath the wings supporting the school and its activities.
