PTA CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2018-19

A brief summary of the many activities organized by both the PTA and the School over the past academic year (2018-19 were as follows

There were 4 Executive Committee Meetings, 3 General Body Meetings and today's Annual General Meeting during the course of the year. High Teas were organized at each of our GBM's by different sections of our school.

At First PTA General Body Meeting was the introduction of the Head Boy, Head Girl and the Prefect body to the parents and teachers.

- At The Second PTA General Body Meeting The PTA Kuruvilla Jacob prizes for academic excellence, PTA Prizes to students securing the highest marks in both ICSE and ISC and IB examinations. Also prizes, for children getting 100% marks in 2 or more subjects, in the ICSE & ISC Exams were awarded respectively.
- The Third PTA General Body Meeting was a special session to converse about the challenges and joys of GROWING UP with Karan Johar. The talk was moderated by Dinesh Vazirani a parent and distinguished alumnus of the school. It was an extremely entertaining afternoon with Karan, and it was very nice of him to take time out of his busy schedule to share his stories with us.
- At the Fourth General Body Meeting there was the Christmas Programme with choristers from all sections - Pre- Primary to Senior School participating. Thanks to the dedicated and enthusiastic music teachers it was a fantastic show.
- For the passing away of Mr T. Thomas, the school held a memorial service in the senior school hall on the 12th of April after which the PTA organised tea and refreshments to all present on this solemn occasion.
- Mrs. Samant said that their focus this year was to organize workshops on topics and issues that are important and fun for our children.
- The first workshop was on dance which was organised for the Middle and Senior School students of grades 8-12 by the Sankhya Dance Company founded by Vaibhav Arekar. It was an outstanding performance and was appreciated by all.
- The Chairperson said that nutrition was of great concern today for our children. The PTA invited Priyanka Agarwal, a nutrition expert to address the students of grades 8, 9 and 10. Priyanka spoke on issues relating to healthy eating and the importance of a balanced diet. The workshop was well received by the children and it was very lively and interactive.

- A Fire safety workshop was held during which students learnt methods of fire extinction and first aid. It was an extremely interactive workshop and students asked many questions. After the talk there was a live demonstration in the Quad on how to use a water hose and a foam hose. The students and teachers both enjoyed using them.

It turned out to be a memorable event and our goal to make it a special day for all was accomplished. - The PTA also arranged cakes and gifts for the teachers of 5 NGOs. Chocolates were also sent for children of some of the organisations on their request.

- The School play this year, the Phantom of the Opera was a huge success. The very professional and extravagant show had an

overwhelming response and was much appreciated by all. Parents helped with make up, costumes and the PTA helped with the raising of funds for the event.

- The PTA along with some very creative and enthusiastic CR's, had decorated the senior school for the Christmas festivities. The Winter Wonderland theme with snowflakes and reindeers was beautifully executed whilst getting everyone into the festive spirit
