

# INTRODUCTION

The school is host to students from varying backgrounds - cultural, ethnic, financial, religious and national. We believe that the diversity adds to the richness of the educational experience that students enjoy at the Cathedral and John Connon School. We thus welcome students from all backgrounds delighted in the knowledge that each student adds a unique flavour to the ethos of the school. The School does not discriminate against any student on the basis of race, religion, nationality and ethnicity and aims to treat all students with dignity, free from any intimidation by staff or peers. Diversity is encouraged.

# **ADMISSION PROCESS**

# <u>In-house students</u>

- 1. The DP programme is introduced to the students and parents of Grade 10 in two individual sessions which provide information on requirements of the programme.
- 2. Admission forms are available online and students have to fill in relevant details as well as their choice of subjects.
- 3. A group meeting of Vice principal, DP Coordinator, Assistant DP Coordinator and teachers teaching Grade 10 is convened by the Principal.
- 4. Each applicant's academic and non-academic performance and progress in senior school (Grade 8-10) is discussed.

- 5. Additionally, a diagnostic test in English and Math may be administered for some students.
- 6. The student shall be informed electronically once the decision on admission is made. On accepting admission, the student shall pay the Admission Fee by the date mentioned in the offer letter.

# External Students

- 1. The school website provides all information required for application to the DP programme. Applicants have to fill in relevant details online.
- 2. Applicants have to take a diagnostic test to ascertain their level of academic competence in the subjects they have chosen. The diagnostic test does not purport to be the defining feature of the admission process, which is holistic in its approach, but is intended as a guide in the process of selection.
- 3. Qualified students are called in for an interview. The Admission Board may comprise the Head of School, DP Coordinator and others. This is to ascertain the following:
  - a. that the student meets the academic rigor required for the Diploma Programme
  - b. that the student meets the school's behavioural expectations and has done so in the past in his/her previous school
  - c. that the student understands and embraces the school's mission
  - d. that the school may ascertain any special needs of the student and whether the school can meet those needs
- 4. The student shall be informed electronically once the decision on admission is made. On accepting admission, the student shall pay the Admission Fee by the date mentioned in the offer letter.

#### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

Students applying for admission to the Diploma Programme in Grade 11 should be between 16 to 18 years and must satisfy a minimum set of academic requirements, which may include, but not be limited to:

1. Academic records of Grades 8, 9 and 10, up to the date of application.

2. Other certificates of achievement.

3. English as a medium of instruction in the previous school.

4. Some common subjects of choice between Class 10 and those opted for in the Diploma to allow for sequential learning.

5. Any student who is already able to understand and respond to spoken and written language on a range of common topics will not be offered language ab initio as this would not provide an appropriate academic challenge. (Diploma Programme Assessment Procedures 2020 pg. 38)

6. A Subject will be offered only if there is a minimum of 5 applicants.

7. On accepting the offer, the student must submit:

a. School leaving certificate from their previous school.

b. A copy of the birth certificate.

c. All personal information related to health that shall be treated with confidence.

d. Documents to support learning difficulties, if any. (Inclusion Policy Pg.No.6)
